Ideally all councillors have their own council email address Named positions have position@ addresses, i.e. treasurer@ Ideally addresses like contact@ deliver mail to all councillors, etc The council notes that there is an expectation for councillors to read, produce, and manage a range of document types. This includes having the software necessary to read and produce these document types This includes the safe storage of information, both from a privacy and security perspective, and from a hardware failure perspective The council notes that the last decade has seen the rise of collaboration tools, that allow for documents and data to be shared between individuals and worked on at the same time. The council notes that communication and conference tools play a part in communicating with the public, topic specialists, other councillors, and other groups and organisations. Providing councillors with a standard, shared tool base would be of benefit for experience and knowledge sharing. The council notes that Microsoft, via their Microsoft 365 (formerly Office 365 depending on timing) product, addresses all notes above, and depending on subscription level, offers additional tools that could be leveraged in community engagement activities. 	The council notes that at their inaugural meeting in Oct 2022, verbal permission was given to Councillor William Nelson to take control of and update the council website.
	The council notes that having an online presence is an important tool in sharing information with the community, providing a way for the community to communicate with the council, and in providing other digital services the community may access or make use of.
	Councillor William Nelson has evaluated the website provided by Spanglefish.com. It has a very basic user access control system, and no content management system to speak of. The Councillor for ease of maintenance, content capacity, and user and content management will transition the council's web site to Wordpress.com.

Description	The council notes the Ordnance Survey(OS) offers the Public Sector Geospatial Agreement to the public sector (Ordnance Survey). This is free access to public bodies, including community councils, to the full range of data products from the OS.
	The council notes that other bodies and organisations provide or offer geospatial information, notably local authorities in their assets registers and some planning applications.
	The council determines that joining the OS PSGA program and gaining access to the mapping and other data provided would enable the council to prepare detailed and accurate maps to inform discussion across a range of topics that may arise during the business of the council.
	 Examples of usage may be: Mapping the impact of a decision, outcome, or other event by post code references Accurately displaying planning submission data for presentation to the community Accurately mapping community proposals, areas of interest or concern, etc to
	 present to the Local Authority or other bodies Being able to reference up-to-date mapping information from a trusted source, and be able to use it without extra legal concerns

Date Title	Improvement of Island Internet 2022
Description	The council notes the national plan to phase out the copper/plain switched telephone network (PSTN) in this decade (Openreach).
	The council notes that the island is served by telecoms fibre via the BT Highlands and Islands Submarine Cable System, and that the previous major internet technology upgrade to Fibre to the Cabinet (FTTC) on the island did not cover the whole island (ISPReview, 2015).
	The council notes the continuing increase of the importance of digital connection in society, as evidenced by recent government legislation on the minimums of an internet connection and how available it should be to access (Ofcom, 2022).
	The council notes there are various funding pools that may be available to islanders, to improve their internet connection, including the Scottish Government R100 project and the UK Government Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme (Digital Scotland).
	The council, taking in the above, determines that a full Fibre to the Premise (FTTP) rollout for all properties on Bute is the best way to advance and future proof the island's access to fast and stable internet.
	The council will want to avoid if possible parts of the island getting left behind again should the upcoming FTTP rollout not reach them, get ahead of the upcoming PSTN shutdown, and address the failure of FTTC to reach all parts of the island at this time, and large parts that are reached not delivered good speed.
	The council notes it would be of benefit to engage with Argyll & Bute Council and BT over the upcoming FTTP rollout on the island to determine the exact scope of the rollout, and if areas are currently not included, if there are ways to include them while BT's engineers are on island.
	The council notes that Bute BID has also expressed an interest in the rollout of improved internet on the island.

Proposal for a community wide public meeting

The Bute Community Council (BCC) undertakes to convene a Bute community wide public meeting in the spring of 2023 (a date to be finalised for February or March). The purpose of the meeting is

- to evaluate what progress has been made since a previous community meeting convened by a previous BCC in February 2015 to discuss how to reverse the depopulation of Bute.
- to discuss what further initiatives the community believes need to be taken to make Bute a better place to live, work and visit.

The BCC will form a small working group to organise the community wide public meeting and will invite the three elected local Argyll & Bute councillors and up to three members of the local community to contribute to the planning and conduct of the community wide public meeting.
