ARGYLL AND BUTE COUNCIL (A844 ASCOG) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2023



On Thursday 21st September 2023, Argyll and Bute Council made the above named Order under Section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which will make it unlawful for any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle on that length of the A844 Ascog from a point 100 metres south of its junction with Burnside Road extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 40 metres or thereby.

The restrictions, which are required because essential maintenance works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the length of road, will be in operation every day between 0800 hours and 1700 hours from the Seventh day of October until the Twenty Second day of October 2023, but will only have effect in relation to part or parts of the length of road when indicated by the appropriate traffic signs to minimise the potential impact on those affected.

Alternative routes will be signed in an appropriate manner.
